DIRECTION 1

Building the position of the company through active engagement in the integration of the European gas market

Strategic objectives:

- To create a physical hub in the CEE region based on infrastructure operated by GAZ-SYSTEM S.A.
- To integrate the transmission system in Poland with adjacent systems and strengthen its transit function in the region
- To develop internal infrastructure, including by eliminating bottlenecks

KEY ACTIVITIES

- Construction of gas infrastructure that provides direct access to new supply sources
- Commissioning of cross-border interconnections that integrate the Polish and neighbouring systems
- Development of transmission infrastructure in Poland to enable the supply coming from diversified and competitive sources
- Construction of UGS facility and provision of comprehensive services embracing re-gasification / transmission / storage in Poland and the CEE region

DIRECTION 2

Ensuring the security of the transmission system operations and the continuity of transmission services

Strategic objectives:

- To maintain the technical operability of transmission system(gas pipelines and related installations)
- To increase the security of the transmission system operations

KEY ACTIVITIES

- > Optimisation of the performance of operating activities by own technical services
- Maximisation of the degree of repairs performed
- Implementation of target solutions concerning protection of critical infrastructure

DIRECTION 3

Increasing the operational and organisational efficiency of the company

Strategic objectives:

- To complete the cost optimisation process and optimise the company's financing structure
- To adapt the company's IT systems to the needs resulting from the strategic directions
- To pursue a proactive HR policy ensuring the implementation of the company's strategic aims
- To monitor the legislative processes and contribute towards the development of the gas sector

INVESTMENT PROJECTS PLANNED BY 2025

- National Ten-Year Network Development Plan (nTYNDP) 2016–2025 is a continuation of the priority aims included in the previous development plan.
 This relates in particular to:
 strategic investments
 - gas supply diversification / gas market integration
 - gas market development
 - security of supply
 - elimination of bottlenecks in the transmission system.





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BASIC SCENARIO

- Regasification capacity of LNG terminal in Świnoujście increased up to 7.5–10 bcm/y
- Connection with Denmark up to 10 bcm/y
- Expansion of the transmission system in North-Western Poland to distribute gas from these directions

UGS facility to be located most likely in the area of Damasławek.

ALTERNATIVE SCENARIO

- Regasification capacity of LNG terminal in Świnoujście increased up to 7.5–10 bcm/y
- FSRU in area of the Bay of Gdańsk up to 10 bcm/y
- Expansion of the transmission system to distribute gas towards the south-east (export to Ukraine)

UGS facility to be located most likely in the area of Białogard.





THE TRANSIT ROLE OF THE TRANSMISSION SYSTEM IN POLAND



- Investment projects enable the development of an integrated regional market with the annual consumption of approx. 70 bcm
- Creating an attractive mix of supply possibilities in the CEE region
- Increasing the economic competitiveness of markets in the CEE region
- Increasing competition between gas suppliers
